Confirmation classes are in full swing for the year. One of the things we ask the students to do is answer a few questions about worship when they attend. There is a place on the worship notes form for questions, and the students

often have some great ones. I thought I would share a few of these questions and answers with you.

Where do you get the communion wafers? There are a number of companies that sell church supplies. Along with communion wafers and a variety of chalices, plates, and other communion supplies, these companies often also sell things like candles, what the pastor wears, things we use to decorate the space, baptismal supplies, Sunday school curriculum, and Bibles. Really anything a congregation might need.

How do you decide what Bible verses to read? We use what is called the Revised Common Lectionary, a three-year rotation of assigned readings for worship. It is called common because it is used by a number of denominations, so if you visit a Roman Catholic, Episcopal, or Methodist congregation, you may hear the same readings we are using on Sundays. It unites us with our partners and allows people from different traditions and congregations to consider and discuss these scripture passages together, even if they attend different services.

Why were there people standing up front with the family for baptism?

Typically, a family or individual chooses baptismal sponsors, often called Godparents, who make promises to support the baptized in their life of faith. These people are present for the baptism and throughout a person's life to walk with them as they learn to live as a Christian.

Can anyone be a member of the church?
In the Lutheran tradition, a member of a congregation is a baptized Christian who wishes to be a member. So, yes anyone can be a member. A person may join the congregation by being baptized, transferring from another Christian congregation, or affirming their baptism in the congregation.

I hope this little Q & A has been helpful. There are more great questions I may share answers to in the future. For now, I will leave you with one more from our youth for you to ponder – How can I be a neighbor?

Outdoor Improvement Projects

Phase 1

In September, construction of a sidewalk to the playground began and sections of the parking lot are being replaced to eliminate some tripping hazards.

Aubrey was given a blanket made by our Friday Quilters and was presented with a book from our Baby Book Club.






Youth Activity Coming Soon!
